## Living with your host family

Your host family have been carefully chosen by the school. You should feel comfortable and happy with your family. If for any reason you have a problem, you must speak to reception who will try to help you.

Please make sure you read the student code of conduct carefully and follow it when staying with your host family.



## In addition;

- You will also be told a curfew time which is acceptable to your family and the host family.
- Please make sure you always have your phone charged and your host family's telephone number and the school emergency number saved on it.
- You must tell the school if you are ill or are going to miss a class. The school will need to confirm
  the reason for non- attendance with your host family.
- You must tell the school immediately if someone is upsetting you or you feel you are being bullied.

#### **Core Values**

In the UK, as in many countries, we have core values to ensure we maintain a tolerant and supportive society. These values apply both in and outside school. • **Democracy** – voting, freedom of choice, making decisions together

- Rule of law follow UK laws, school rules
- Freedom of the individual entitlement to opinion, don't discriminate
- Respect and tolerance of other faiths and beliefs show mutual respect to others regardless
  of faith, gender, age, beliefs.

#### The Law for under 18s

## It is illegal to:

- Buy or drink alcohol.
- Buy tobacco products and cigarettes.
- Enter nightclubs, bars, and pubs.
- Publish inappropriate pictures on social media. If you post something that is threatening or abusive
  to a person, it may be a criminal offence. If the photo, video, or text is about someone under the
  age of 18 (including yourself) it is possible it could be seen as child abuse, which can be given a
  jail term punishment.

You will be asked for ID to prove that you are over 18 years old if you try to enter a nightclub and also in some bars and pubs even the cinema.



# Alcohol and young people - the law (gov.co.uk)

If you are under 18 and drinking alcohol in public, you can be stopped, fined, or arrested by the police. If you are under 18, it is against the law:

- for someone to sell you alcohol
- to buy or try to buy alcohol
- · for an adult to buy or try to buy alcohol for you
- to drink alcohol in licensed premises (e.g., a pub or restaurant)

You will also be asked for ID to prove you are over 25 if you try to buy alcohol in a supermarket or shop.
